Winchester's Board of Aldermen members voted to contract with the City of Ballwin to perform the duties of Building Inspector, Plans Examiner and Code Enforcement Officer beginning last year. The arrangement is being continued. Ballwin City Hall is located at #1 Government Center, Ballwin, MO. and Winchester residents will need to contact Ballwin to apply for and pay the fee for Housing Inspections (\$100) and Building Permits. The phone number of Ballwin is

636-227-9000 and the number to call to schedule inspections is 636-227-2129. Any duty performed by Ballwin will be done according to the City of Winchester Municipal Codes. If you have any questions, you may contact Winchester City Hall at 636-391-0600.

Appropriate applications are available at Ballwin Government Center, Mon-Fri, 8am - 5 pm.

CITY MEETING NEWS



In service to the community, your Board of Aldermen took the following actions during **June & July, 2019**:

Ordinance

#1,079 - an ordinance authorizing the Mayor to sign an agreement with the City of Ballwin for full time police service for a term of five (5) years commencing on the 1st day of January, 2020, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 2024. The contract amount to be paid the first year is \$153,792.00 and will be adjusted in future years by multiplying the two-year rolling average of the Consumer Price Index. The current rate for the 2019 St. Louis County Police Contract is \$210,680.69. The contract with Ballwin will result in a savings of at least \$56,888.69 for the City of Winchester in 2020.

#1,080 - transfers all pending and future municipal ordinance violations to the Ballwin Municipal Division of the St. Louis County Circuit Court.

#1,081 - authorizes the collection of a \$4.00 Convenience Fee for accepting payments of court costs by means other than by cash or negotiable instrument.

#1,082 - amends Ordinance #1,079 by changing the date by which *Ballwin is to take over the provision of police services* from St. Louis County. The change of date from January 1, 2020 to *October 1, 2019* was agreed to by St. Louis County Police, and the City of Winchester. The final Ballwin approval for this change is scheduled to take place on August 19th.

With summer in full swing, the West County Precinct would like to remind citizens to be cognizant of a few things.

Keep your doors closed, especially at night. Protect yourself, as well as your belongings from those who would enter through unlocked doors leading into your home or your car.

The St. Louis County Police Home Safety Handbook suggests the following:

KEY CONTROL

True security begins with key control. When you move into a home, always have the locks rekeyed. You should also take this step if you lose your keys. A locksmith can rekey your locks without replacing them in most cases.

Do not "hide" an emergency key outside your residence. It is better to trust a friend or neighbor with a spare key for emergencies. Never have a name printed on your house keys. If the keys are lost or stolen, you may have a problem.

Keep car keys and house keys separate. This way your house keys are never left with a stranger.

Keep vehicles that may be visible to a passers by locked. If you must keep valuables in your vehicle, keep them out of sight.

Exterior doors on houses should be of solid core construction, at least 1-3/4" thick. The door frame should also be of heavy construction.

PARK & RECREATION NEWS

PET WASTE



Pet waste left in yards can provide food for rodents. It also comes into contact with storm water which carries pollutants into the storm

sewer system and cause viruses and parasites that can infect humans with dangerous pathogens such as salmonella. Studies by the EPA have found that bacteria levels are often elevated 100% after a rain. One way to reduce that level is to clean up after your pets. Not doing so is a violation of Municipal Code. Remember, residents who walk their pets must be responsible and prepared to clean up after their animals on any city property. Not doing so is a violation of Municipal Code.

Tips for a successful rain garden

Trimming and Pruning: Stems from grasses and flowers can be left through the fall and winter to add visual interest and to provide food and cover for birds. Trim plants near the surface during appropriate months with a string trimmer or pruner and remove dead vegetation to encourage new growth. Shrubs may be pruned to give them the "shape" you like.

Fertilizing: Appropriate fertilizer during the first year may help establish healthy plants. Fertilizer beyond this is not necessary because it stimulates weed growth and reduces water quality benefits.

Mulching: A two to three-inch application of mulch after initial planting is beneficial. Replacement of old mulch in the spring helps with the garden appearance and drainage. Use standard single or double shredded hardwood mulch that is "well aged" (at least a year since it was shredded) and free of soil, weed seeds, herbicides, etc. Pine bark and "chipped" mulch is not recommended as it tends to float and wash out easily.

Trash: Trash and other debris like leaves and grass clippings should be removed as needed. Please do not pile or spread leaves or grass clippings in your rain garden.

Edges: A border defines the edge of the garden just as a frame defines a painting. A strip of mowed turf, stones, or a walking path can set the area apart and can improve rain garden appearance. All landscape requires maintenance; a rain garden is no different. Following these maintenance tips will help ensure the rain garden functions well and remains an asset to your home.

Water Ponding: After a rain shower, it is normal to see shallow ponding in the rain garden for a day or two. Please do not fill in the ponding area. If water is still observed after three days, then it may be necessary to rake or poke shallow holes in the soil. If water is still observed, replace the top layer of soil and mulch.

Weeding: Weed growth during the plant establishment period is typical and weed removal helps eliminate competition with desirable plants. Weeds can be addressed with spot use of herbicide or by pulling. Blanket use of herbicide is never recommended. Diligent weeding during the first two years produces desirable plants that, by year three are mature enough to compete and crowd out most weeds.

Watering: The plants in your rain garden should not require watering once mature plants are established; however, watering helps plant appearance during drought periods.



SECTION 215.015 A:
MAINTENANCE OF TREES AND
SHRUBS - Just a reminder to all
property owners that it is the
responsibility of the property owner
or occupant to maintain any trees

along the right of way that may be hanging over the street. Limbs are to be kept trimmed to a height of at least ten (10) feet above any part of the street so as not to interfere with persons or vehicles using the sidewalk or street. Maintenance includes being watchful and making sure that any dead limbs in the tree be removed to reduce the effect of wind and storms as best possible.

PROGRAM (H.I.P.) The Home Improvement Program (HIP) is a federally funded program to provide technical advice and financial assistance to qualified homeowners for a variety of home repairs. A participant can receive 100% of the cost of correcting authorized repairs based on a maximum benefit limit of \$5,000. IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO MAKE RESERVATIONS - LOTS OF DAYS AVAILABLE

The pavilion and Gazebo at Reber Park are available for use from **April through October** of each year, 7:00 a.m.- 8:00 p.m. for special functions, family reunions, barbeques, and birthday parties. The City offers reservations either individually and/or together.

The cost to reserve the pavilion is \$45, the gazebo, \$30.
