The City of Winchester is divided into two Wards known as Ward I and Ward II. The dividing line between Ward I and Ward II shall be a line beginning at the intersection of the center line of Sulphur Springs Road and the eastern prolongation of the south rear property line of Hillcrest Boulevard; thence westwardly along the south rear property line of Hillcrest Boulevard to its intersection with the center line of Lindy Boulevard, thence northwardly along the center line of Lindy Boulevard to its intersection with the center line of Hillcrest • Boulevard thence westward along the center line of Hillcrest Boulevard, to its intersection with the southern prolongation of the west rear property line of Lindy Boulevard, thence northwardly along said west rear property line to its intersection with the north rear property line of Hillcrest Boulevard, thence westwardly along said north rear property line to its intersection with the west city limits of the City of Winchester.

Ward I shall constitute all of the area with the boundaries of the City of Winchester that lies South of the above described line dividing Ward I and Ward II.

Ward II shall constitute all of the area within the boundaries of the City of Winchester that lies North of the above described line dividing Ward I and Ward II.

## Safety Tips for Citizens

Below are some tips that may help you prevent crime. But remember—the most important single

act you can do is to call the Police to report crimes or suspicious activities! If law enforcement is not aware of problems, they cannot resolve them. Here are some tips for homeowners to use so that they can help the anticrime effort.

- Install good deadbolt locks and use them.
- Use timers to turn lights off and on in a normal schedule when away from home.
- Adequately secure all windows with secondary locking devices.
- Lock any non-attached structure to ward off theft.
- Leave exterior lights on at night
- Do not advertise that you are away from home.
- Be neighborly, but be suspicious of strangers in the area.
- Record serial numbers and maintain a record of your property in a safe place, preferable other than at your home.

The following information is presented from the stormwater library of the Phase II Stormwater Management Plan which has been initiated by the Federal Government through the EPA.

Everyone lives in a watershed. Storm water runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snow melt flows over the ground in the watershed. Hard surfaces like rooftops, driveways, sidewalks and streets prevent storm water from naturally soaking into the ground.

Is Storm Water Runoff a Problem? Storm water runoff can pick up soil, trash, fertilizers, chemicals and other debris, and carry it into a storm sewer which transports it directly to a lake, stream, river or wetland in your

watershed. Anything that enters a storm sewer goes untreated into the same water bodies we use for swimming, fishing and drinking water. The way you take care of your home and yard impacts water quality.

All municipal parks in the City of Winchester shall be closed between the hours of Dusk and 7:00 AM and a person shall not be in the parks during those hours except as authorized by Pavilion or Gazebo permit.

#### **REBER PARK PAVILION & GAZEBO** RESERVATIONS

Beginning in 2013, reservations for the pavilion and gazebo were available the first business day in February. The facilities may be reserved individually and/or together. Hours are from 7a.m. - 9:30 p.m., April through October. These facilities are great for special functions, family reunions, barbeques, and birthday parties. Restrooms are specifically designated for the parties reserved. Cost to *reserve the pavilion is \$45, the gazebo, \$30*. Both residents and non-residents are eligible to reserve the facilities.

requires a housing inspection whenever a change in occupancy or ownership occurs. So, whether you decide to rent, sell your home, or move out and have other family members move in, an application for a housing inspection must be completed. Please consider the following:

 $\triangle$ A minimum of 24-hours notice is required before the inspector can inspect your property; You must pay the \$70.00 inspection fee before the inspection can take place – The inspector does not accept payment and an adult must be present during the inspection.

An occupancy permit is required for all residents  $\triangle$ before they move into their home; however, the City must have an approved inspection on file before the occupancy permit can be issued. Occupancy Permits are \$10.00 and upon application, we provide useful information to the new resident.

#### **UNIMPROVED GROUNDS PARKING..**



Parking in the City of Winchester is permitted on roadways & driveways only. It is unlawful to park on unimproved surfaces

and/or off the roadway.

This does include parking a car with one or more tires on the grass, with the remaining tires on the roadway or along the curb.

Parking in this manner can damage the curb and is a violation of City Ordinance, punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00. If BUILDING PERMITS - Play it safe and check with Ony see this happening, please notify your St. Louis County Winchester Neighborhood Police Station.
