A Municipal Election will be held in the City of Winchester, St. Louis County, Missouri, on Tuesday, April 2, 2019, to elect one Alderman from Ward I and one Alderman from Ward II, each to serve a two (2) year term.

Declaration of Candidacy for said offices must be received by the City Clerk, Monday thru Friday, during regular business hours. Filing begins on Tuesday, December 11, 2018 at 8:00 a.m. The closing date will be on Tuesday, January 15, 2019, at 5:00 p.m.

A candidate must be a qualified voter properly registered under the laws and the Constitution of the State of Missouri. A Candidate must not be in arrears in any unpaid City of Winchester taxes and must have been a resident of the City of Winchester for at least one year preceding the election.

The City of Winchester is divided into two Wards known as Ward I and Ward II. The dividing line between Ward I and Ward II shall be a line beginning at the intersection of the center line of Sulphur Springs Road and the eastern prolongation of the south rear property line of Hillcrest Boulevard; thence westwardly along the south rear property line of Hillcrest Boulevard to its intersection with the center line of Lindy Boulevard, thence northwardly along the center line of Lindy Boulevard to its intersection with the center line of Hillcrest Boulevard thence westward along

Winter Wonderland is open Wednesday, Nov. 21, 2018 - Sunday, December 30, 2018. (Closed Christmas Eve).

Winter Wonderland is open for vehicular traffic and carriage rides every day except Mondays and Saturdays

from 5:30pm-9:30pm. Saturdays are reserved for carriage rides only. Mondays are reserved for Winter Wonderland Walk only.

All vehicular traffic to Winter Wonderland **MUST** enter from south bound McKnight Road.

From Interstate 40/64 head south on McKnight Road. Vehicular traffic should stay to the right and enter the park from the McKnight Road entrance gate. All traffic will exit the park from the Litzsinger Road exit gate.

HOLIDAY TRASH SCHEDULE -

PARK & RECREATION NEWS

All municipal parks in the City of Winchester shall be *closed between the hours of Dusk and 7:00 AM* and a person shall not be in the park during those hours except as authorized by Pavilion permit.



BALLFIELD RESERVATIONS - Reber Park's two ballfields are available for Organized League Team Practice from April 1st...or when the fields are deemed usable by the City..until

the last week of June each year. Ballfield Reservation Forms will be available at City Hall beginning Wednesday, January 2nd at 9 a.m. Walk-in applications will be accepted for time slots on a first come, first served basis. You will know when, and on which field you will be practicing, before you leave City Hall.

In order to recoup certain expenses, it has been determined that each athletic team using the ballfields in Reber Park will be required to pay a one time per season user fee of \$50.00 as partial recoupment.

Each team is limited to *<u>one practice session each week</u>*. Practice sessions are two hours and are available:

WINCHESTER NEIGHBORHOOD STATION (Info taken from the St. Louis County Police Home Safety Handbook)

Alert to Winchester Residents: With the holidays just around the corner, our police officers are concerned about the possibility of increasing incidents of theft from automobiles. Remember to 1) keep your valuables in the trunk or under the floor mats if you do not take them with you when you exit. Keep a record of model and serial numbers of your property.

2) roll up windows & close sunroof; *do not leave car running unattended (a bad wintertime habit);* lock your vehicle; do not hide car keys in or on the vehicle; activate car alarms and use steering wheel locks.

3)pay attention to your surroundings... be proactive, park in well-lit & public areas, pay attention to suspicious activity in the area, report suspicious activity to the police, don't linger around, or in, your vehicle. Most importantly, minimize distractions, remember where you parked and have your keys ready.

On October 27th, the St. Louis County Police held a drug take-back event at City Hall. In case you missed it, there is a drop box at the West County Precinct that is available 24/7*.

Items accepted are prescription medications, all over-the-counter medications, pet medications, vitamins and supplements, medicated ointments, lotions, creams and oils, liquid medication in leakproof containers, homeopathic and herbal remedies and suppositories.

Items not accepted are illegal drugs, needles/sharps, syringes with needles, thermometers, IV bags and tubing, bloody or infectious waste, personal care products, empty containers, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans and inhalers.

* **Drop box location.** You may take your items to St. Louis County, West County Precinct at 232 Vance Road, Valley Park. OPEN 24/7.

Is StormWater Runoff a Problem? Yes! Stormwater can pick up soil, trash, fertilizers, chemicals and other debris and carry it into a storm sewer which transports it directly to a lake, stream, river or wetland in your watershed. Anything that enters a storm sewer goes untreated into the same water bodies we use for swimming, fishing and drinking water. The way you take care of your home and vard impacts water quality. Please adhere to the following requests from MSD:

- Never allow pesticides, fertilizers, or any other materials to be washed down or put into storm drains.
- Do not dump yard waste onto a creek bank or • storm drain where it will be washed into creeks or rivers untreated.
- Purchase and use nontoxic, biodegradable and recyclable products whenever possible.
- If you must buy an item that is hazardous, be sure to buy only as much as you need and follow the instructions on the label and properly dispose of the excess at a household chemical collection. Recycle reusable materials. Cleanup discarded trash as this can be carried by runoff into the streams.
- Never allow roof gutters to drain directly to the street or storm drains. Allow the water to flow over vour lawn.
- Reduce the amount of paved area and increase the vegetated areas on your property where storm water can soak into the soil.



CORP - County Older Resident Programs

CORP is part of St. Louis County Government's Department of Human Services. Residents of St. Louis County 60 years of age and older are eligible for a wide variety of services. OFFICE OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (H.I.P)

The Home Improvement Program (HIP) is a federally funded program to provide technical advice and financial assistance to qualified homeowners for a variety of home repairs. A participant can receive 100% of the cost of correcting authorized repairs based on a maximum benefit limit of \$5,000. Winchester has been
